**Behavioral Management** - Families of young children sometimes need extra support when it comes to managing behaviors which are disruptive to daily family life & relationships with siblings, friends and family. Our Special Instructors help parents with management ideas, information & resources how to help your child and help you help your child manage their behaviors.

Many of these methods which are used to help improve processing are very appropriate for children who have Autism and related spectrum disorders.

## ABOUT US

Bright Tomorrows provides free of charge Early Intervention support and services to families and caregivers of infants and toddlers with developmental delays in their homes, daycares, or other community settings. Children ages birth to three years old are eligible for free services if they demonstrate a developmental delay or is at risk of developing a delay.



## Funding for Services

There is no cost to the family for these services. Early Intervention is funded through IDEA-Federal legislation, Part C, which provides for Early Intervention for infant and toddlers - birth to 3, and through PA Act 212, which is Pennsylvania Early Intervention Services System Act. Eligibility for services is determined through an evaluation in the child's home or community setting. Referral to Early Intervention can be made directly by a family member (including foster parents and guardians) who has concerns about their child by contacting Project Connect at 1-800-692-7288.

### Physical Therapy

Provides support for your child's development of gross motor skills such as learning to roll, sit, crawl, walk, run, and jump. PT can also help to improve your child's coordination and balance in the home, outdoors, and in the community.



### Speech Therapy

Helps to develop communication skills and early language. Your Speech Therapist is there to help you as a parent to promote your child's ability to use language in everyday situations so they can be understood and so they understand family members and friends.



### Occupational Therapy

May be useful in helping your child learn to use both hands (fine motor skills) to play and to do self-help skills such as assisting in dressing, washing, and feeding themselves.



### Special Instructors

Will work with you to promote play skills (which lead to life skills), self-help skills, behavior management, thinking and learning skills, and attention.
